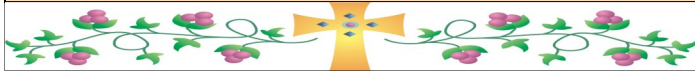

## THANKFUL FOR OUR OUTREACH TO THE NEEDY IN OUR LOCAL AREA

As we celebrate Thanksgiving this week the following article, which appeared in the November 10th Ladies Night Out supplement published by NJ Hills Media Group, is shared with you so that you might know the great good that we as a parish are involved in. Many thanks to Randa Wallisch and all who contribute, volunteer and work so hard to allow the needs of others to be met. Happy Thanksgiving to all.

*The Saint Vincent de Paul Food Pantry housed inside the Saint Vincent de Paul Roman Catholic Parish, 250 Bebout Avenue in Stirling, has been in existence for more than 20 years. It serves, on average, 60 families each month through the truly generous support of the Long Hill Community.*

*“We are truly grateful to each person who thinks not only of their own loved ones while grocery shopping but also about those who may currently need a little assistance feeding their families,” organizers said.*

*Many people take part in giving to the food pantry through the two major food drives each year: the U.S. Postal Service “Stamp Out Hunger” food drive held each spring and the Boy Scouts of America Food Drive held in the fall.*

*The pantry also receives contributions from local schools, other area churches, local Scouts, Community Day events and many other organizations that have collected copious amounts of canned goods in an effort to relieve hunger in our area. Drop-offs are also accepted at the church throughout the day and evenings. Food donations can be placed in the wicker basket found in the Narthex of the church. Additionally, anyone wishing to make a cash donation to the food pantry can do so by dropping their donation off at the St. Vincent de Paul Parish House, which is located on the corner of Chestnut Street and Central Avenue in Stirling.*

*Among the most requested items are: white rice in 2 or 5 pound bags, canned and dry beans, especially black, pinto and navy beans, canned tuna, peanut butter, canned vegetables, especially corn, mixed vegetables, peas, beets, refried beans and green beans, pancake mix, macaroni and cheese, canned fruit, hot chocolate, coffee, pasta, especially spaghetti noodles, cereal, especially Honey Nut Cheerios, Corn Flakes and Frosted Flakes, oatmeal, soups, especially Chicken and Rice, Chicken Noodle and Vegetable, sardines, instant mashed potatoes, sugar, ketchup, mustard, and canned tomato products, especially diced tomatoes, and tomato sauce and paste.*

*Anyone with a need is welcome to take advantage of the program, said Randa Wallisch, the food pantry’s volunteer coordinator. The only requirement is that they bring a utility bill, official correspondence or identification with their name printed on it. The information is confidential and only is used to establish a personal relationship with each recipient, she said.*

*Upon registration, each client is presented with a sturdy, reusable bag that they bring back on the third Wednesday of each month. The clients receive some basics every month, like rice, beans, spaghetti sauce, cereal, pancake mix, hot chocolate or coffee, canned fruit and vegetables. In addition, they are given a shopping list written in both English and Spanish that details other available offerings. The clients can choose as many items as they wish, provided all of the items fit into their reusable bag, Wallisch said. “We will work that bag to get everything in. We very seldom take an item out,” Wallisch said.*

*Recently, the volunteers have added a hot, fresh-cooked breakfast to kick off the distribution day. Wallisch said clients generally begin to line up about an hour before the 9:30 a.m. opening time and were happy to be invited in for a hot meal. Breakfasts typically include items like bacon and scrambled eggs, sausage and biscuits, oatmeal, coffee and hot chocolate. Kid-friendly options are also available, including cold cereal, applesauce and fruit cups and fresh milk. Wallisch said the pantry is very blessed to be located in a wonderful community like Long Hill. “Seniors who are struggling to put food on their own tables will still donate one or two cans,” she said. “People here are very generous.”*

*How you can help:*

- Donate items of food to the pantry.
- Volunteer to work at a food giveaway, which are held from 9:30 a.m. to noon on the third Wednesday of each month.
- Pass the word along to those you know who may be in need.
