## PASTORS COLUMN

### Dying and Rising—the Christian journey of hope through mercy.

The sacred season of Lent began for us this past Wednesday with the imposition of ashes. One of my favorite lines from the Scripture (and I have many) comes from the first Book of Samuel chapter 16, verse 7. It is spoken in relation to God's choosing David as King when others would have not viewed him as the likely candidate. Through His prophet Samuel it is revealed that, "God does not see as a mortal, who sees the appearance. The Lord looks into the heart". This struck me when reading the words of the Prophet Joel which is the first reading at Mass on Ash Wednesday, "Even now, says the Lord, return to me with your whole heart, with fasting, and weeping, and mourning; Rend your hearts, not your garments, and return to the Lord, your God." Joel 2:12 God alone reads my heart and every human heart. God alone knows what truly motivates us. As Christians we are called to reveal the presence of Jesus in our lives by the words and actions of our day to day living. This is not something that we can keep hidden or turn on or off when we feel like it.

This season affords us the opportunity to reflect on how true our love for God is. We begin each season of Lent reminded by Jesus of the foundations of life in Christ: Prayer, fasting and almsgiving. Prayer immerses us into the heart of God's presence where we open ourselves to God alone who is the One we trust with every joy and sorrow. In prayer we should say little with our lips and much from our heart. God sees in secret and is familiar with our every need and desire. Fasting frees us from focusing on the tempting and temporary luxuries of the appetites of this world so that we can hunger more for Jesus, His way, His truth and His life. Almsgiving is more than just charitable giving. Almsgiving is what we do when we have satisfied the biblical advice to tithe. Almsgiving helps us to be thankful for what we have and to ask what can I do to be a blessing to others beyond what is expected of me. God is not a minimalist, nor should we be.

In his Lenten letter to the Church, Pope Francis offers helpful insight and advice: *"For all of us, then, the season of Lent in this Jubilee Year is a favourable time to overcome our existential alienation by listening to God's word and by practising the works of mercy. In the corporal works of mercy we touch the flesh of Christ in our brothers and sisters who need to be fed, clothed, sheltered, visited; in the spiritual works of mercy – counsel, instruction, forgiveness, admonishment and prayer – we touch more directly our own sinfulness. The corporal and spiritual works of mercy must never be separated. By touching the flesh of the crucified Jesus in the suffering, sinners can receive the gift of realizing that they too are poor and in need. By taking this path, the "proud", the "powerful" and the "wealthy" spoken of in the Magnificat can also be embraced and undeservedly loved by the crucified Lord who died and rose for them. This love alone is the answer to that yearning for infinite happiness and love that we think we can satisfy with the idols of knowledge, power and riches. Yet the danger always remains that by a constant refusal to open the doors of their hearts to Christ who knocks on them in the poor, the proud, rich and powerful will end up condemning themselves and plunging into the eternal abyss of solitude which is Hell. The pointed words of Abraham apply to them and to all of us: "They have Moses and the prophets; let them hear them" (Lk 16:29). Such attentive listening will best prepare us to celebrate the final victory over sin and death of the Bridegroom, now risen, who desires to purify his Betrothed in expectation of his coming.*

*Let us not waste this season of Lent, so favorable a time for conversion! We ask this through the maternal intercession of the Virgin Mary, who, encountering the greatness of God's mercy freely bestowed upon her, was the first to acknowledge her lowliness (cf. Lk 1:48) and to call herself the Lord's humble servant (cf. Lk 1:38).*

May this be your best Lent ever. Let us pray earnestly for one another.

**Second Reading: Philippians 3:17—4:1**

Paul urges the Philippians to avoid becoming too interested in material possessions. He reminds them that their most important wealth is their faith in Jesus, which will lead them to eternal life.

**Gospel: Luke 9:28b-36**

Jesus took Peter, John and James to a mountain to pray. When his clothes grew incredibly white, Moses and Elijah appeared. They spoke of the scripture he was to fulfill. Then a cloud came down and a voice said, "This is my Son, my Chosen One. Listen to him." The disciples who had seen Jesus' glory did not disclose this experience to anyone until much later.

**Lenten Regulations**

**Abstinence** -- Catholics over 14 years of age are bound to the obligation of abstinence. Abstinence is to be observed on Ash Wednesday and on all Fridays of Lent. On days of abstinence, meat may not be used at all.

**Fast** -- Catholics over 18 and up to the beginning of their 60th year are bound to the obligation of fasting. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are the days of fasting. On these days, only one full meal is allowed. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids, including milk and fruit juices are allowed.

Regarding other weekdays of Lent, participation in daily Mass and the voluntary observance of fasting is recommended. Commendable, particularly during Lent, is generosity to local, national and world programs of sharing our abundance, the traditional Lenten Devotions and all the self-denial summed up in the Christian concept of "mortification."

**NOTIFICATION OF HOSPITALIZATION ILLNESS OR IMPENDING SURGERY**

Hospitals are required to observe confidentiality and privacy laws and are not permitted to inform us of admissions of parishioners to their facility. It is now necessary for the patient, a family member, or a health care proxy to notify the parish at the time of hospitalization. Arrangements then can be made for hospital/ health care facility visits once we are notified. Because of privacy laws we do not publish the names of the sick in our bulletin or announce them at Mass unless the patient or a family member gives us permission to do so. The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick will be administered upon request prior to a scheduled hospital admission or before any elective surgery. Please call the parish office 908-647-0118.
